

Thousands needed for urgent repairs

St. Boniface undergoes a full architectural inspection every five years. The cost is met by the Diocese but the Church Council is expected to act on the recommendations made by the experts. The 2008 report has now been received. The church is credited in the report with the work done in recent years to the west end, the nave, north wall and bell frame. The building is described as "well cared for and with a good general standard of maintenance". However, it is 500 years old and there is evidence of

settlement and cracks and damage to water pipes and gullies. The report recommends "urgent and immediate" maintenance work (£8k - £12k), more significant repairs and renewals within 18 months (£45k to £50k) and by 2013 further items including work to the chancel floor (£20k+). The church architect has been asked to prepare a scheme for all work required "within 18 months". The Church Council is hoping to carry out a major repair project next year.

Meltdown?

Joy Parker writes

We are in a mess at the moment. World financial experts and presidents and prime ministers can't solve it.

The money markets have been borrowing and lending non-existent money. Even ordinary people have been enticed into a "have it now, pay later" culture.

My Granny (and yours) could have told them and us you don't get owt for nowt. You don't get anything for nothing.

The trouble is that it isn't just those who borrowed recklessly whose homes, pensions, jobs, life savings and peace of mind will be affected. It will affect us all in one way or another. It will affect many people catastrophically.

Where is God in all of this? Why doesn't he save us from ourselves and each other? God, as we know, gave us free choice. He hopes we will choose the good, but there isn't much virtue in being good if that is all you can be.

When humanity chooses badly, God weeps with us - as we do over **our** children's mistakes. God is in it with us, he suffers too and wants to help us weather the storm, learn from our mistakes or the mistakes thrust on us.

God created us because he wanted to have a deep and loving relationship with us. He loves us beyond compare. His greatest wishes are that we love him, believe in him, believe that Jesus loves us to the extent of giving the

whole of himself for us and our salvation, and that we love those around us without counting the cost to ourselves. We may be worried for ourselves, but it is God's earnest hope that we will look outwards, rather than selfishly inwards. We are rapidly approaching the turn of the year. 2009 will be a hard year. We have the kindly heart, but we need to cultivate the seeing eye if we want to know how to meet the needs of 2009.

God is very much in the present crisis with us. God expects his church to be ready to respond to the needs of his people **inside** and **outside** the church in every way they can, and he is alongside us.



"I first got to know Jane over twenty years ago and my first impression of her as a wonderful bundle of energy was more than borne out in the years that followed.

She was a very active person - a keen badminton player (she always played to win) and line dancer and member of the W.I. She was an enthusiastic and efficient gardener too; husband John claims that it was she who had the

green fingers while he was just the labourer, but between them they made a great team. Jane loved being outdoors and even in recent times when she was far from well, a stroll around the garden, doing a spot of deadheading, acted as a real pick-me-up.


